THINGS TO KNOW

- Most of the activities, including productions, will be held at Zion Lutheran Church in Ironwood. They have generously and graciously donated space for us to hold meetings as well as perform. We are hoping that this will be a permanent home for the ASDC!
- We will be holding club meetings on a regular basis.
- Productions may be a separate activity from the regular club meetings depending on the production.
- An audition process will be followed. Students will need to understand that their behaviors, such as following instructions, and demonstrating respect toward fellow students, participants and the adults, will be taken into account when the directors are choosing their cast. Students will not be guaranteed an acting part, but will be guaranteed the ability to participate in other areas for the production, such as backstage, set design, makeup, props, etc.
- A student CANNOT participate without the EXPECTATIONS form completely filled
 out and signed by both the student and the parent, and given directly to the
 appropriate group leader. Should a student come to a club meeting with a signed
 document without the parent, they will not be allowed to attend again until the
 leader has made direct contact with the parent.
- And finally, this year we will be doing the production of Shrek the Musical, Jr. This
 production will take place in March of 2025. This will be a wonderful opportunity for
 the kids to experience Musical Theater. More details in a few weeks!



The Mission:

• The Mission of the 4th-6th grade ASDC is to build foundational skills and knowledge related to all aspects of Theatre Arts.

When:

Mondays from 3:45pm to 5:15pm.

What:

 This club is designed in a Workshop format so that the kids can choose to attend on the days that the content interests them.

How:

• A schedule of the "Workshops" will coincide with each school semester. The amount of Mondays for each workshop will vary depending on the content. We will be asking kids to sign up ahead of time so that each instructor is prepared with the correct amount of materials. If your child does not sign up in advance, it is possible that they would not be able to participate for the days designated. However, if your child does sign up and decides it is not what they want to do, they can choose not to attend the rest of the days designated for that particular workshop.

**USE OF WORDS THAT ARE COMPLEMENTARY, NOT DEMEANING

**ACCEPTING AN OPINION OF THEIR PEERS

**RAISING THEIR HANDS TO ASK A QUESTION

**STAYING IN THE SPACE ALLOTTED FOR THE ACTIVITIES

**TOUCHING OR HOLDING ITEMS THAT ONLY BELONG TO THEM

**THROW AWAY ANY GARBAGE THEY HAVE CREATED

**HELP CLEAN UP AND PUT AWAY ANYTHING THAT AN LEADER ASKS THEM TO

**KEEPING THEIR HANDS TO THEMSELVES-RESPECT THE PERSONAL SPACE OF OTHERS

**TAKING RESPONSIBILITY FOR THEIR BEHAVIORS

EXPECTATION OF PARENTS: PARENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ENSURING THEIR STUDENT(S)

ARRIVES ON TIME AND IS PICKED UP ON TIME. THE PARENT WILL COMMUNICATE WITH THE LEADER

STUDENT ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR HELPING TO PAY FOR THE DAMAGE DONE.

AWKWARD STAGE DRAMA CLUB STATEMENT:

WE BELIEVE EVERY STUDENT BELONGS IN THE ASDC. PART OF THIS CLUB'S MISSION IS TO TEACH STUDENTS SOCIAL SKILLS, RESPECT FOR ADULTS AND THEIR PEERS, AND APPROPRIATE SELF ADVOCACY.

HOWEVER, IF SEVERAL ATTEMPTS HAVE BEEN MADE AND A STUDENT CONTINUES TO INTERFERE WITH THEIR OWN AND OTHERS' LEARNING, THE STUDENT WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO CONTINUE TO ATTEND THE WORKSHOP.

HOWEVER, THE STUDENT WILL ALWAYS BE ACCEPTED INTO ANOTHER WORKSHOP. IF THE BEHAVIORS CONTINUE DURING EACH NEW WORKSHOP, THE ASDC MAY CHOOSE NOT TO ACCEPT THE STUDENT INTO ANOTHER WORKSHOP UNTIL THERE IS A CONFERENCE WITH THE STUDENT AND THE PARENT.
